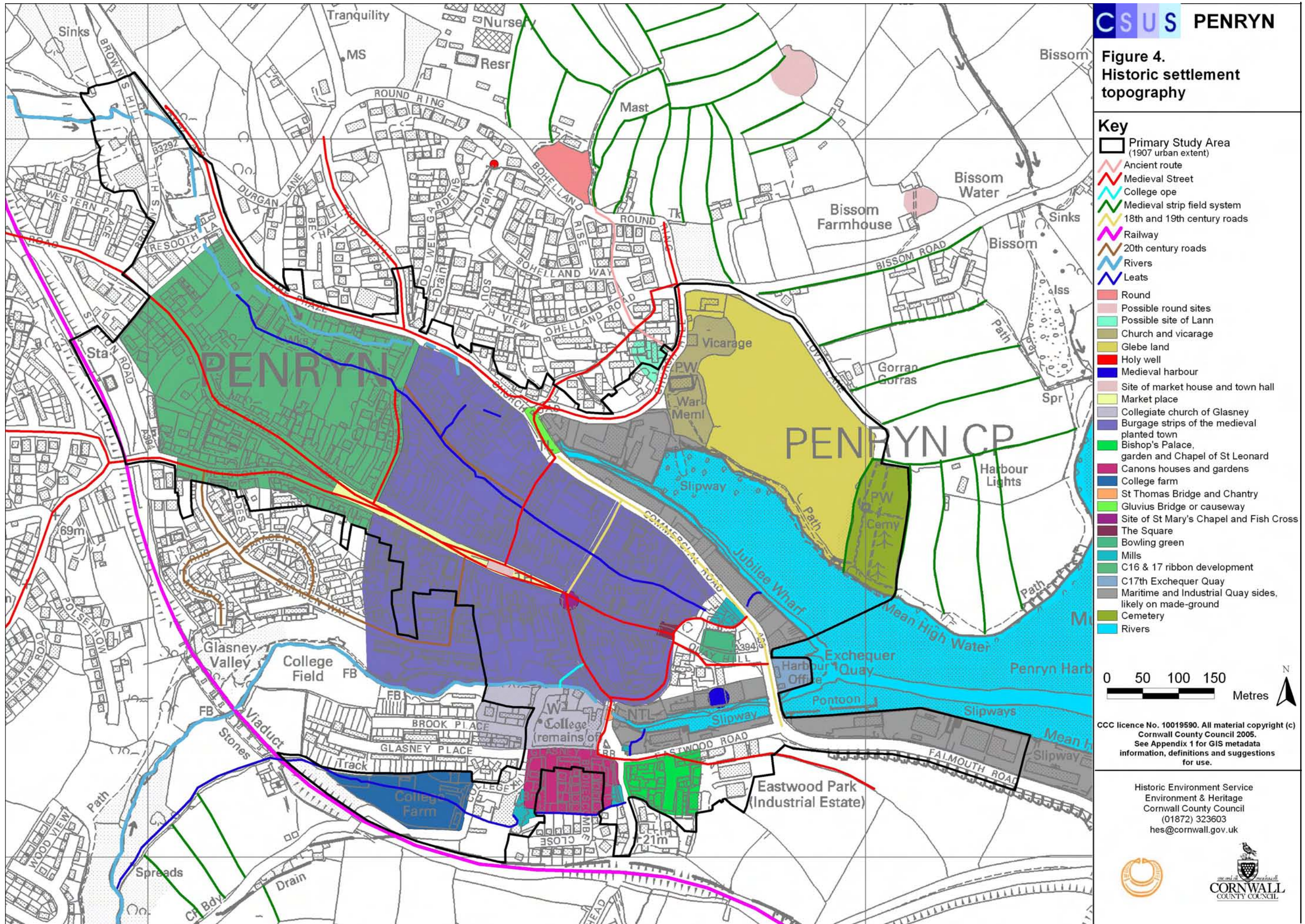
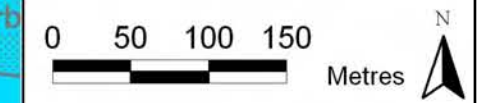


Figure 4. Historic settlement topography
